1.1 Purpose and Compliance:

Development in southeast Aurora is embarking on a new frontier in design and construction. New standards for strategic planning have been created by the City of Aurora and present innovative opportunities for community design. The E-470 Corridor Design Standards and the Title 32 Design Criteria outline patterns for the City that will update the neighborhood image and refresh the Aurora vision. Beacon Point wishes to flourish amidst the thousands of acres planned in the City and to actively direct the ultimate creation of this exciting new project. The following Design Standards are an important step in outlining the open space network, landscape, community entries, and architecture. They provide the groundwork for nearly everything that will eventually become Beacon Point.

These Design Standards are written with the intention to direct builders, architects, designers, and homeowners towards the theme established and desired of Beacon Point. The purpose for creating these standards is to meet the Metro District Design Criteria for Residential Title 32 Districts and to elevate the level of quality at Beacon Point, consequently raising the bar within the City of Aurora.

In addition to meeting the subsequent metro district standards, all building, construction, and design parties are expected to observe the design criteria established by the City of Aurora; including but not limited to, landscape, fence, and brick ordinances, the City Code of the City of Aurora, and the E-470 Corridor Zoning Regulations and Design Standards and Procedures. The Beacon Point Standards may be more restrictive than the existing City of Aurora codes and ordinances, but do not intend to modify or supersede their outline or intent. In the case of a discrepancy and for items not covered, the appropriate jurisdictional regulations and codes shall take precedence and the most restrictive standards shall apply.

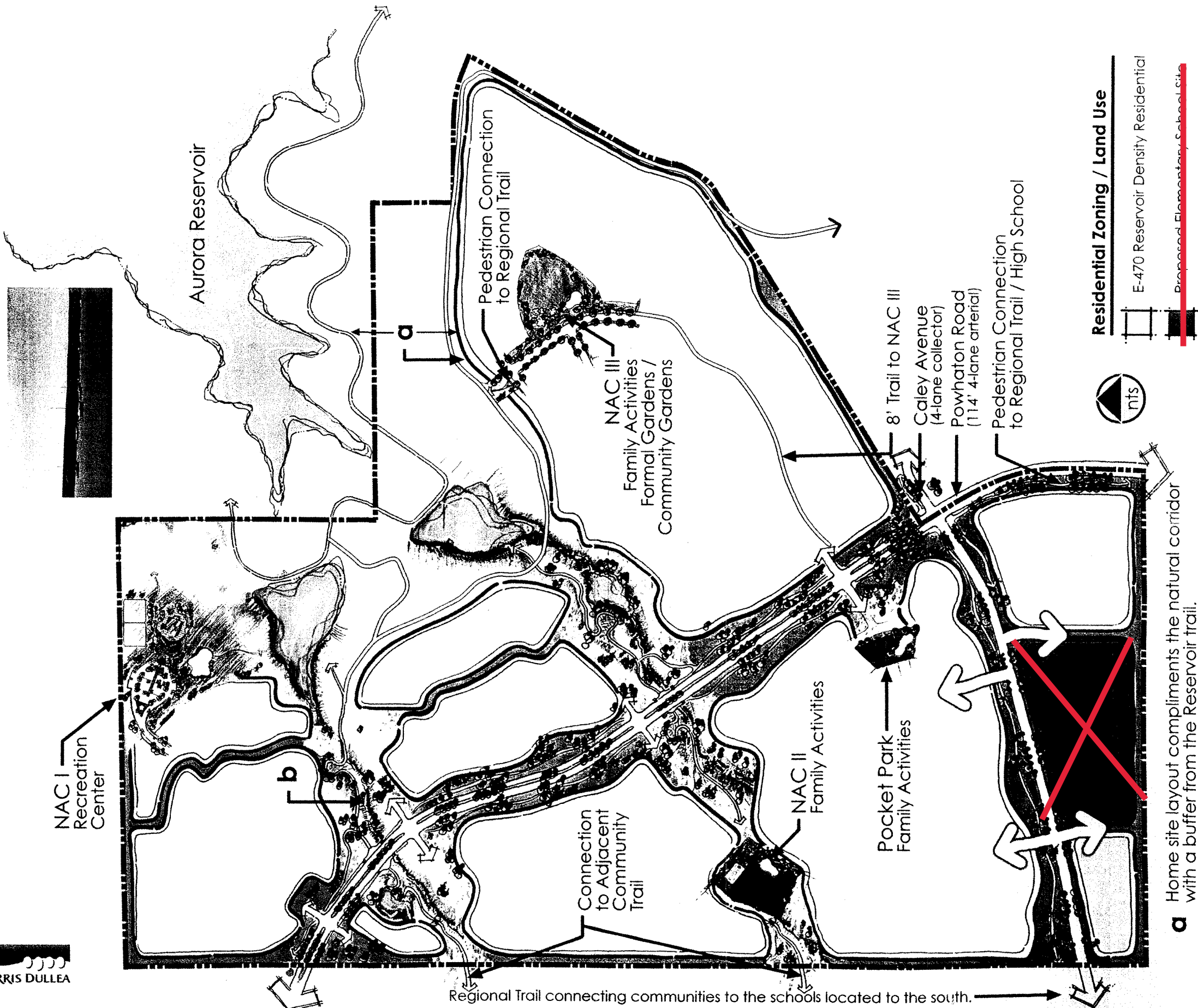
